



MACLA Curatorial Fellowship

MACLA/Movimiento de Arte y Cultura Latino Americana is an inclusive contemporary arts space grounded in the Chicano/Latino experience that incubates new visual, literary, and performance art in order to engage people in civic dialogue and community transformation.

Background:

Founded in 1989 as the result of a broad community mobilization in the City of San Jose and nationwide on behalf of multicultural arts, MACLA has evolved into a well-respected arts organization known for our commitment to artistic excellence and civic dialogue. More than 38,000 people participate in the 50 programs MACLA produces annually. Our core program tracts include: visual arts; performance and literary arts; and youth arts education

MACLA Values:

- **Inclusive** - MACLA values diverse ideas, perspectives, cultures, sexual and gender identities and creates a space where all are welcomed, respected, and treated with equity.
- **Collaborative** - MACLA convenes individuals with shared values to partner with us as thought leaders and partners to implement innovative and effective programs which inspire and engage our community.
- **Integrity** - MACLA holds ourselves to the highest ethical and professional standards in our decisions, actions, and communications.

As an organization grounded in Latinx arts and culture, we strive to provide a space for the development of Latinx leadership within our community.

Purpose of Fellowship:

MACLA is creating a pipeline for Latinx students interested in contemporary Chicano/Latinx art and culture scholarship to increase diversity and representation in the field. Ideal candidates are interested in pursuing a career as a curator, arts administrator, and/or cultural worker. Curatorial Fellows will work under the direction of the Visual Arts Curator. Fellows will be involved in a range of curatorial projects including the various stages and aspects of planning, installing, and de-installing exhibitions. Fellows will collaborate on exhibition checklists, graphics, catalogue production, and documentation. Fellows will also gain experience in arts administration and professional expectations in the workplace.

Description of the paid curatorial fellowship:

- Visual Art Exhibitions: With a focus on Chicanx/Latinx contemporary art, the Fellow will participate in the planning, research, installation, and evaluation of exhibitions and related public programs, while earning the byline as Co-Curator for one exhibition. The Fellow will produce digital products, including writing a curatorial statement/brochure, adding to an online archive, and producing content for aforementioned digital archive to be published on social platforms and printed. The Fellow will gain insight into how our exhibitions are curated, spending a third of the fellowship focusing on the gallery installation process. Fellows are expected to assist in quarterly exhibition installation, which involves painting walls, using power tools, handling artwork, and lifting large objects weighing a minimum of 30lbs.
- Studio Visits: Curatorial Fellows will be invited to join the Visual Arts Curator on artist studio visits. With the guidance of MACLA's curator, studio visits will provide the opportunity to interview artists and build meaningful relationships.
- Gallery Visits: As an opportunity for insight into practices, the Curatorial Fellows will visit local and regional arts organizations, along with one trip to a national Latinx arts institution.
- Gallery Front Desk: This position is expected to cover at least one gallery shift (open gallery hours are Wednesday – Sunday 12-5PM).

Eligibility

- Bachelor's degree or equivalent experience required; graduate students are preferred. An ideal candidate has a BA degree in Art History, Visual Cultural/Criticism, Latin American History, Cultural Anthropology, Sociology, Chicano/a/x Studies, or equivalent.
- MACLA will prioritize candidates who are committed to working with arts and culture organizations.
- Must be able to work on-site. MACLA is located in downtown San Jose. MACLA cannot provide travel or relocation stipends.
- As a part of our commitment to health and safety, COVID-19 vaccination is required for all current and newly hired employees, contractors, interns, and fellows.
- Must be able to lift 30lbs.

Terms

This role is an in-person, part-time fellowship averaging 15-25 hours per week during the academic year and 25-30 hours per week during the summer at \$34.45/hr over a 10-month period for a total of 935 hours. Eligible for paid sick time as defined by CA state laws. **This role is contingent on continued financial support by the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS).**

To Apply:

Studies show that BIPOC apply to 20% less jobs because they feel they are underqualified. We encourage you to apply even if you don't meet every single qualification.
